UN Secretary General's Statement on the Occasion of UN day 2012

"On this UN Day, let us reaffirm our individual commitment and our collective resolve to live up to the ideals of the United Nations Charter and build a better world for all."

Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon Message on the occasion of UN Day, 2012

In 1947, the UN General Assembly declared 24 October, the anniversary of the Charter of the United Nations, as which "shall be devoted to making known to the peoples of the world the aims and achievements of the United Nations and to gaining their support for" its work. In 1971 the General Assembly adopted another resolution (United Nations Resolution 2782), declaring that United Nations Day shall be an international holiday and recommended that it should be observed as a public holiday by all United Nations member states.

Devastation in New Jersey

Though we had no electricity, it was so enlightening to feel the serenity after 7 P.M. when everything was dark - no electricity, no computers, no appliances running. The darkness silenced people, as they began whispering, slowing down, staying indoors, even altering their circadian rhythm (our inner biological clock). I noticed people went to sleep earlier and woke up earlier with the sunrise. We had no desktops, laptops, BlackBerries, Bluetooth, Kindles, iPads, iPhones (or other cellular phones), pagers, or faxes. Until, of course, the generators began polluting the air with their exhaust and harsh sound.

Instead we had iHeal, and we used our inner skills to entertain ourselves. We planned events with one another (those in proximity) such as walks, and while walking we helped people in need in our neighborhood; we did yoga with friends, we gathered around candles and told jokes and stories. We stayed calm, meditating and praying. Of course without electricity we could not watch TV, which was a blessing. Others were glued to their TV sets, bearing witness to the media sensationalizing all the atrocities, crying, and getting more and more upset with each news story and eyewitness account.



AASSSG LAUNCHES THE EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL KRIEGER ESSAY CONTEST FOR HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE STUDENTS

The Armenian American Society for Studies on Stress & Genocide (AASSSG) was founded in 1988 by Dr. Ani Kalayjian to advance national and international understanding of the generational and intergenerational effects of traumatic experiences, such as genocide, earthquake, and war. In 1995, 80 years after the Ottoman Turkish Genocide of the Armenians (1915-1923), AASSSG established an annual essay contest as part of its commemorative activities.





The Association for Trauma Outreach and Prevention (ATOP)Meaningfulworld team attended and participated in the 2012 American Psychological Association 120th Annual Convention, which took place in Orlando, Florida. The convention featured internationally known presenters on various topics as well as programs that highlighted the latest research discoveries. Programs and sessions covered issues such as immigration, racism, eating disorders, clinical practice, social networking and psychotherapy. ATOP presented in various symposiums as well as participated in various divisional meetings.

Specifically, ATOP organized and presented on the symposium entitled "Survivors and Consumers of Sexual Trafficking - Research Findings, Causes and Treatment," co-chaired by Dr. Kalayjian & Dr. Pipinneli. Dr. Kalayjian provided key insights into the psychological issues that lead to the causes of human sexual trafficking, what the United Nations is doing about it, and interventions for healing the survivors. Several key American Psychological Association members attended this symposium including Dr. Philip G. Zimbardo. In fact, Dr. Zimbardo and Dr. Kalayjian had a discussion concerning the topic related to the

consumption of human sex trafficking and its economic and political ramifications.

Educated for Change? Muslim Refugee Women in the West

As you turn each page you explore the painfully emotional journey Muslim refugee women face in search of educational freedom. A battle against Westernization and a struggle to maintain Eastern Islam is illustrated through examples of cruel, harsh actions taken against defiant women in search of education. Anyone using tools associated with the West is shamed and disgraced as a way to maintain fundamentally religious Somali culture dominated by males. In each section of the book, refugee women reveal their challenges by describing their desire to receive the same education as men, as well as their plight to transform this unhealthy system. As our president states: Humanity is like a bird with two wings, one male and the other female. If we cannot receive equality in education our human race will not fly to any meaningful height. They went looking for help and encouragement from their families, refugee camp workers and friends but were often faced with feelings of shame and rejection. By combining Western derived human rights and Muslim inspired ideals, many refugees hope to create a new way of being Somali that will allow equal opportunity.

Tool Kit for Working with Veterans

The Department of Veterans Affairs has developed a new online Community Provider Toolkit (www.mentalhealth.va.gov/communityproviders) aimed at delivering support, therapeutic tools, and resources to community providers treating Veterans for mental health concerns. The goal of the Community Provider Toolkit is to enhance the delivery of mental health services to Veterans. This is done by increased communication and coordination of care between community providers and VA. It provides information to veterans about accessing communicating with and making referrals to VA. It also provides tools to assist Veterans who are dealing with a variety of mental health challenges. The toolkit also includes sections intended to future educate providers on military culture.
