A Message from Secretary General Ban Ki-Moon

New York, 1 February 2013

For billions of people around the world, faith is an essential foundation of life. It provides strength in times of difficulty and an important sense of community. The vast majority of people of faith live in harmony with their neighbours, whatever their creed, but each religion also harbours a strident minority prepared to assert fundamentalist doctrines through bigotry and extreme violence.

They also contravene the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which affirms the right of all to freedom of thought, conscience and religion. It is imperative that the moderate majority is empowered to stand firm against the forces of extremism. But, this can only be achieved through strong leadership.

Once again, The Association for Trauma Outreach and Prevention (ATOP) Meaningfulworld organized a parallel event presenting a symposium on *Empowering Women Around the Globe: Transforming Violence through Mind-Body-Eco-Spirit* on 14 March, 2013 at the UN. The conference warmly welcomed close to a hundred attendees from academia, NGO's, grass root organizations, UN staff and others who came from near and far. We provided ATOP membership applications, information handouts, as well as the 7- Step Integrative Healing Model. Symbolic figures and energy balancing healing oils collected from around the world set the peaceful atmosphere for the panelists and the audience.



The conference ended with a Q&A period led by Dr. Kalayjian. Questions were raised regarding why do men engage in violent acts? Why are some men so gentle yet unappreciated by women? On Wednesday, December 19th, 2012, Dr. Ani Kalayjian, founder and president of the Association for Trauma Outreach and Prevention/ Meaningfulworld, will appear on an edition of Open, hosted by Daren Jaime. Dr. Kalayjian will discuss the trauma of the school massacre in Newtown, Connecticut that occurred the prior Friday, as well as her work with victims of trauma and survivors from around the globe.

Known as an internationally recognized expert on mass trauma, Dr. Kalayjian has been committed to healing survivors locally and internationally, has served on United Nation panels, and has been a psychology professor at Fordham University.

Liberating Kosovo: Coercive Diplomacy and U.S. Intervention

Book By: David L Philips Review by ATOP Meaningfulworld intern Victoria Alexander

In the book *Liberating Kosovo: Coercive Diplomacy and U.S. Intervention* by David L. Phillips, the history of Kosovo's existence and fight for independence from the Serbian Republic of Yugoslavia is examined and an in depth timeline of the foreign aid they received throughout their struggle is brought to light. Kosovo and the Kosovars' nine year struggle for freedom is a less well known part of history. Phillips spends the majority of the book highlighting the enormous effort given from U.S. politicians in combination with the unyielding resilience of the Kosovars throughout a decade to ultimately lead to their independence in 2008.

While U.S. domestic advocacy through various politicians helped bring issues involving Kosovo to higher platforms, international negotiations between countries didn't always result in favor of the persecuted territory. Numerous attempts to promote freedom in Kosovo like the United States deployment of troops to Yugoslavia in the early 90's and the UN's effort to take preventative measures to protect Kosovo from outside threats through the peace keeping operation United Nations Preventative Deployment Force (UNPREDEP) fell short and faced continuous road blocks from outside nations and their economic tensions with one another.

Liberating Kosovo presents the reader with a step by step story of Kosovo from the start to finish. Throughout the text we are reminded of the importance to work together as U.S. leaders, politicians, NGO's and citizens to maintain ethical human rights in our own community as well as abroad. David L. Phillips incorporates and details these meaningful issues into Liberating Kosovo while promoting them in his daily life and work as Director of the Program on Peace-Building and Rights at Columbia University.


