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Meaningfulworld 13th Humanitarian Mission to Haiti 15 – 29 June, 2018

**Humanitarian Empowerment, Healing, Transforming Horizontal Violence, Meaning-Making, and
Establishing Peace and Forgiveness Gardens**

The 13th Humanitarian Mission to Haiti by ATOP Meaningfulworld will commence on 15 June, 2018. The team will be led by Meaningfulworld Ambassadors; Dr. Any Kalayjian, Lorraine Simmons, Sowmya Kshtriya and Bryant Zuniga. The goals for the mission have expanded from transforming horizontal violence, establishing Peace and Forgiveness Gardens, nurturing sustainable education in regard to emotional intelligence (EQ), establishing neighborhood associations, and nurturing resilience, to include: supporting the founding of a Meaningfulworld local branch to create a more sustainable educational and healing foundation, and outreach to the Minister of Education for implementing EQ training and education on disaster preparedness. Drawing on the experience of past missions, including our work immediately following the earthquake in 2010, the team will be attending and presenting at the two day Conference at Center for Spirituality and Mental Health (CESSA), conducting an intensive 4 day program for the people involved with creating the new Meaningfulworld branch in Haiti, providing a 2 day intensive program for teachers, staff, parents and students with the Haiti Partners, a progressive school in Petionville, as well as offering workshops to local faith based ministries, community organizations, local orphanages, the Police Department and Coast Guard.

The work of Meaningfulworld is geared towards many of the most vulnerable populations in Haiti, often struggling with a myriad of personal and collective challenges. A majority of past Haitian participants in our mission have reported anxiety, fear, and stress associated with the poverty, discrimination, oppression and racism that they face on a daily basis. Situations of betrayal, isolation, horizontal violence, domestic violence, corporal punishment, and mistrust have often exacerbated these sentiments.

Haiti consistently ranks among the poorest countries in the world, and the poorest country in the Americas. Below are some of the top challenges facing Haitian communities: 1. Two out of three Haitians live on less than \$2 per day; 2. Fifty percent of urban Haitians are unemployed; 3. Negative impact of climate change; 4. Less than 50% of households have access to safe water; 5. Haiti's literacy rate is 61% – 64% for males and 57% for females while the average literacy rate for Latin American and Caribbean developing countries is 92%; 6. Fifty percent of Haitian children do not attend school; 7. Poor access to clean water, and dehydration.

To support the efforts of the government as well as grass roots organizations in Haiti, the ATOP Meaningfulworld team aims to continue the success of its past 12 Humanitarian Missions to Haiti by continuing to nurture healthy relationships with ongoing collaborators, promoting forgiveness, decreasing trauma symptoms, transforming horizontal violence, and facilitating meaning-making. This is largely achieved through the teaching of our 7-Step Integrative Healing Model to students, disaster survivors, educational faculty, advocates, seminarians, and administrators (Kalayjian 2012). In addition to the 7-Step Integrative Healing Model, we wish to continue inspiring healthy communication and connection through workshops, group discussions, meditation, and energetic chakra balancing Soul-Surfing exercises.



I am **Dr. Ani Kalayjian**, President and Founder of ATOP Meaningfulworld, and Professor of Psychology at Teachers College, Columbia University, and at John Jay College of Criminal Justice. Haiti has been in our hearts and souls and has motivated us to plan an outreach annually since 2010, and this is our 13th mission. We have a deep connection with the Haitian people, and we empathize with their suffering from the devastating earthquake, the political dysfunction, the horizontal violence, as well as the everyday human-made traumas. Our goal is to nurture a generation of conscientious Haitians who are motivated with love, inclusion, forgiveness, and unity with a volunteer spirit.
