



## Meaningful World Launches the Twenty-Eight Annual Krieger Contest on Preventing Genocides

FOR HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE STUDENTS

**Essay Subject: "What the Legacy of Genocide Means to Me"**

**2022 Awards**

- \$100.00 for High School student winner**
- \$200.00 for College/University student winner**

### **Eligibility and Submission Criteria:**

1. Students must be enrolled in high school (Grades 10-12) or college/university (undergraduate level); they must be residents of New York, New Jersey, or Connecticut.
2. Essays must be original and unpublished.
3. Essays must include social, psychological, philosophical, or human rights perspectives, and ideally should reference to multiple genocides both current and past, multiple references, books, research, and eyewitness accounts.
4. Essay must explore the concept of denialism practices against all genocides that are mentioned in the essay
5. Essays must be in English, typewritten, double-spaced, and 1,000-2,000 words in length.
6. Must include the Ottoman Turkish Genocide of the Armenians and other Christian minorities in 1915 and current events in Artsakh.
7. All submissions become the property of AASSSG and will not be returned.
8. AASSSG reserves the right to make no award(s) each year if, in the opinion of its three judges, the submissions do not meet its criteria.
9. All entries must be postmarked by **24 April 2022**. The winners will receive personal notifications by May 2021. Awards will be given at the United Nations in June.

### **NEW VIDEO CONTEST**

#### **We welcome you to submit a short film, same deadline as above & same wards:**

1. The videos must follow the theme of the Annual Krieger Essay contest on preventing genocide on the subject of "What the Legacy of Genocide Means to Me."
2. The participants must be enrolled in high school (grades 10-12) or college/university students.
3. Participants must be residence of NY, NJ, or CT.
4. Videos must be original, unpublished, creative and must be in English with references at the end of the film.
5. The videos must include social, psychological, philosophical, or human rights perspectives and should reference to multiple genocides (minimum of 3, must include Ottoman Turkish Genocide) multiple references, research, and eyewitness accounts.
6. The videos must be less than 8 min long.
7. The videos must include information on minimum of 3 genocides. It must include Ottoman Turkish Genocide of Armenians & other Christian minorities, current events in Artsakh plus genocide of Native Americans.
8. The video must include ways to transform govt. denialism towards the committed genocide.
9. The sounds and video images must be clearly recorded and easily viewed.
10. All videos will be viewed by committee and selected few will be posted on social media for public voting.
11. A video collecting the highest Liking of the viewers will be the winner of the contest.
12. The winner will be granted with the title The Best Video of the Year and viewed at our UN event in June.
