



## Nonprofit Leadership Panel

Xavier High School | Virtual Panel, 28 May 2026

Hosted by Mountain Goat Movement

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The objective was to show Xavier students what a life of service truly looks like. Four founders, four nonprofits, four careers devoted to service that has built real community change over time. The aim: to inspire the next generation of servant leaders at Xavier to give their lives to something bigger than themselves.

**Greg Morrissey** is the Founder and Director of Mountain Goat Movement (MGM), which has a partnership with Xavier High School in Manhattan. Attendees included teachers and a cohort of 70 high school boys (ages 14 - 15) who are in a four-year leadership program with MGM. MGM aims to connect students to leading explorers, educators, and social impact leaders. After introductions, each panelist shared their passion, objectives, and future activities.

**Dr. Ani Kalayjian**, *Founder and President, ATOP Meaningful World*

Dr. Ani Kalayjian is a psychologist, trauma expert, author, and humanitarian who has devoted nearly four decades to helping individuals and communities heal from trauma around the world. She is the founder and president of ATOP Meaningful World, the Association for Trauma Outreach and Prevention, an international nongovernmental organization affiliated with the United Nations and dedicated to fostering a peaceful, meaningful, and just world. Since 1988, she has led more than 100 humanitarian outreach missions across 51 countries, & 26 states in USA, delivering mental health rehabilitation in the aftermath of earthquakes, tsunamis, war, and genocide, from Armenia and Haiti to Rwanda, Guatemala, and post 9/11 New York.

A descendant of survivors of the Armenian Genocide, Dr. Kalayjian was born in Syria and emigrated to the United States at sixteen. She holds Master's and Doctoral degrees from Teachers College, Columbia University, where she is a faculty member in Clinical Psychology, and an Honorary Doctor of Science degree from Long Island University. She is the developer of the 7 Step Integrative Healing Model (a biopsychosocial and eco spiritual framework now taught and practiced worldwide), the author of six books including *Forget Me Not: 7 Steps for Healing Our Body, Mind, Spirit, and Mother Earth*, and a representative to the United Nations since 1988. Her honors include the American Psychological Association's Lifetime Achievement Award, Columbia University's Highest Medal of Honor, and the American Nurses Association Human Rights Award.

**Hannah Sklar**, *LMSW, Executive Director, Creamos*

Hannah Sklar is an international social worker with over 15 years of experience working at the intersection of gender-based violence and economic security. After completing her bachelor's degree in social work at George Mason University as a student athlete, she came to Guatemala to begin her work with Creamos. She later returned to New York to complete a master's in social work from Columbia University, focusing on Social Enterprise Administration and

International Welfare and Policy. In 2015, she came back to Guatemala to launch Creamos' Emotional Support Department.

Since becoming Executive Director in 2018, Hannah has been lucky to be a part of Creamos' growth into a multi-service nonprofit serving individuals with adult responsibilities in a recycling community surrounding Guatemala City's landfill. She intentionally works with a multidisciplinary team where community wisdom and lived experience are in genuine exchange with professional expertise, making it possible to accompany participants with true depth. Beyond Creamos, Hannah contributes to broader community efforts through the Community Network of Zone 3's Administrative Committee and Wuqu' Kawaq's IRB Ethics Committee. Grounded in a culturally humble, community-centered practice, she believes that lasting change emerges from long-term presence, deep trust, and solutions built alongside communities.

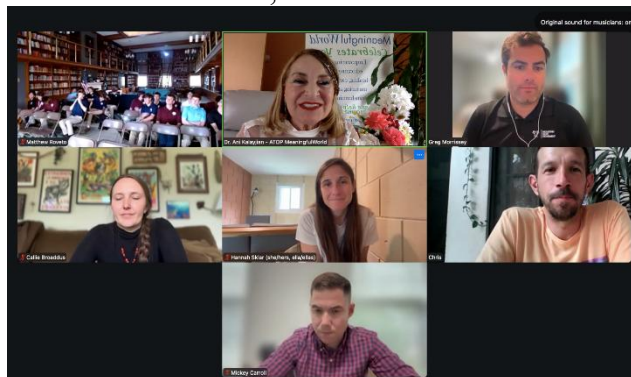
**Callie Broaddus**, *Founder and Executive Director*, [Reserva: the Youth Land Trust](#)

Callie Broaddus is a conservationist, photographer, and nonprofit leader based in Washington, DC. She is the founder and executive director of Reserva: The Youth Land Trust, a global nonprofit she launched in 2019 to empower young people to protect threatened species and habitats through conservation, education, and storytelling. Reserva began with the goal of creating the world's first entirely youth-funded nature reserve and has since protected more than 2,250 acres in the Ecuadorian Tropical Andes, halted a luxury hotel development threatening a UNESCO World Heritage Site in the Seychelles, advanced marine corridor protections in Panama, and is now creating the first protected area for a critically endangered primate in Colombia.

Callie has organized and led more than a dozen research expeditions co-designed with local partners in Ecuador, Colombia, and Panama, and has mentored over 150 young conservationists who have served on Reserva's Youth Council or Board of Directors. She has served on the Rainforest Trust Advisory Council since 2018 and previously served as board member and vice president of the Bull Run Mountains Conservancy. In 2021, she was recognized in the inaugural class of The Explorers Club EC50 for her service to conservation and youth leadership.

**Mickey Carroll**, *Co-founder*, [SFW Conservation](#)

Mickey Carroll is a conservation entrepreneur and co-founder of SFW Conservation, an anti-poaching initiative working to protect endangered wildlife across Southern Africa. Alongside his partners, Mickey helped secure 750 acres of land in Hoedspruit, South Africa to establish a private wildlife sanctuary and preserve, creating a permanent refuge for the region's most vulnerable species. He also designed and launched SFW's immersive 7-to-10-day conservation experience, giving participants a firsthand look at the realities of wildlife protection and the people on the front lines fighting for it. Mickey is passionate about inspiring the next generation to think boldly, act with intention, and build things that matter.



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
